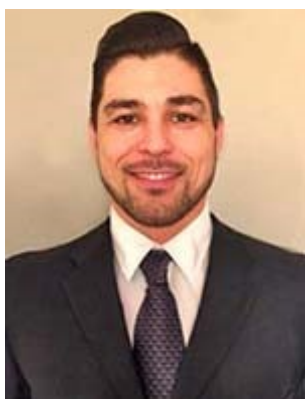

Idaho State Liquor Division Promotes Two Employees

BOISE, Idaho – Idaho State Liquor Division Director Jeff Anderson has announced two internal promotions to key members of the division's staff. Homen and Wiseman previously held other positions within the Division prior to their new appointments, which took effect on April 23, 2018.

Ray Homen, Deputy Director for Procurement and Distribution



Ray Homen joined the Idaho State Liquor Division (ISLD) on August 3, 2015, as a Business Analyst and was named Deputy Director for Procurement and Distribution on April 23, 2018. Prior to joining the ISLD, Homen worked in private industry for nearly 20 years.

Mr. Homen joined the Division after spending nearly three years in the Wells Fargo analytics department. During his time at Wells Fargo, he was responsible for all levels of analytical support, reviewing financial packets for completion, managing data integrity, data entry of financial information, and setting productivity levels. He was involved in many strategic planning assignments and developing process improvements.
