## Andrew Deloney Assumes NABCA Board Chairman Role

ALEXANDRIA, VA (May 24, 2017)— Andrew Deloney, chairman of the Michigan Liquor Control Commission, assumed responsibilities and was introduced as NABCA's board chairman during the Annual Conference yesterday. It had been more than 20 years since someone from Michigan served in this role.

"I am honored by the support of my fellow directors and look forward to working with each of you to continue to move NABCA forward and grow and expand the services that our association provides its members and other organizations," he said.

Among other responsibilities, Mr. Deloney has chaired the Governance, Internal Affairs, Finance, and Industry Relations International and North America committees for NABCA.

He was originally appointed as an administrative commissioner to the Michigan Liquor Control Commission in June 2011 by Gov. Rick Snyder for a four-year term, and was re-appointed in April 2015 for a second four-term that expires in June 2019. At the time of both of his appointments, Gov. Snyder designated him chairman.

Mr. Deloney earned a bachelor's degree from Albion College in Albion, Michigan.
